Registering to Vote

If you are not registered to vote in the Town of North Yarmouth, you can come into the Town Office to do so Monday's 8am-6pm, Tuesday thru Thursday's 8am-5pm. There will be additional hours posted at a later date. You will need a photo ID (license, passport, or Maine State ID) and proof of residency if your North Yarmouth address is not listed on your form of ID.



Absentee Ballots Available Now

Registered voters may vote in person or contact the Town Clerk's Office at 829-3705 to receive a ballot by mail. Telephone requests must be made by the voter only.

Last Day to Request an Absentee Ballot is Thursday, November 3, 2016.




