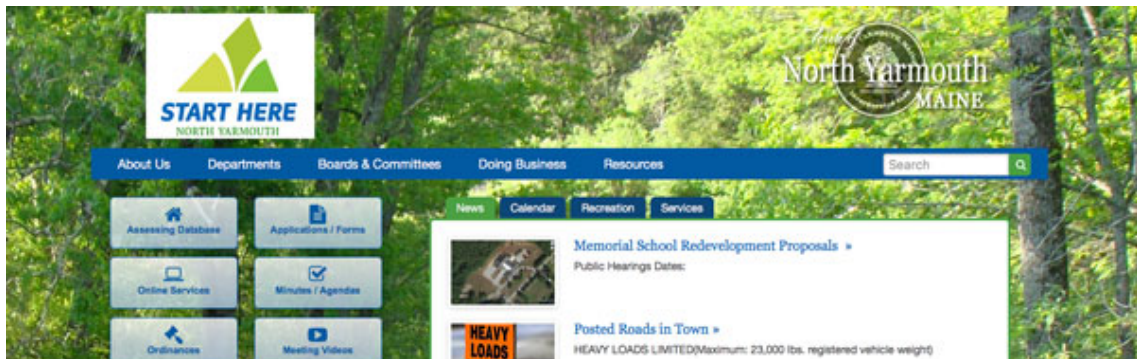
Denise Clavette, Director of Economic Development in Yarmouth, will discuss:

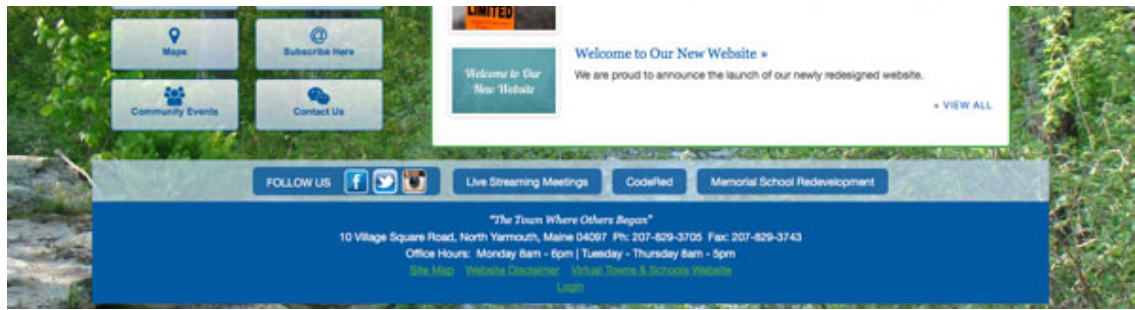
- what economic development might look like for a small town,
