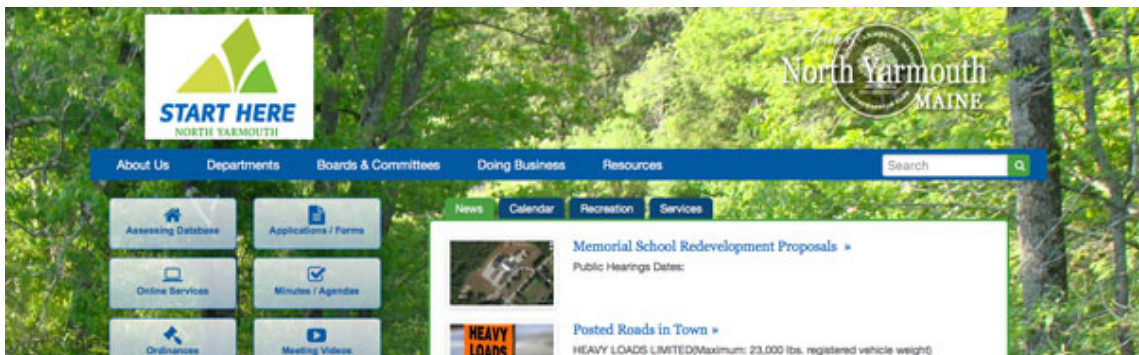

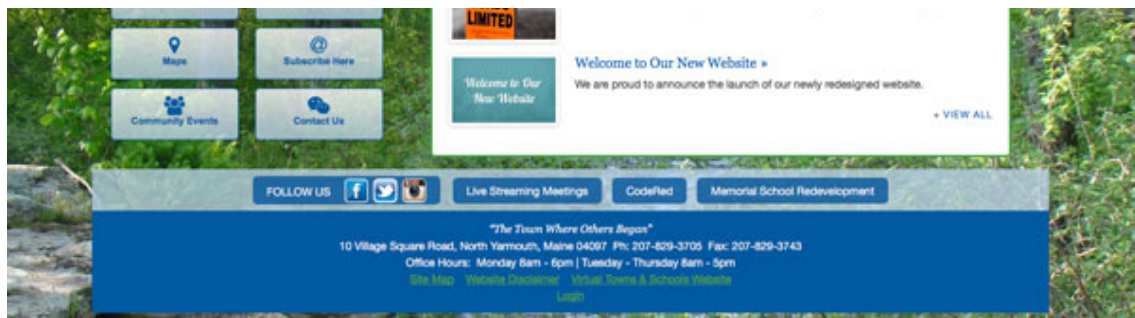

## Westcustogo Building and Design Committee Named

**At a recent meeting, the Select Board named members of the newly formed Wescustogo Building and Design Committee.**

The charge for this committee was also created:

“The Wescustogo Building and Design Committee (Committee) shall propose a plan that will address uses, location and design attributes of a reconstructed Wescustogo Hall. In making its recommendations to the Select Board, the Committee shall be

guided by the conditions and requirements as set forth in the March 8, 1997 warrant article #6 under which the Town accepted the Grange Hall.

The seven (7) member one (1) alternate ad hoc Committee shall accept public comments and keep the Select Board updated on its' progress. The Committee will present a final report of findings and recommendations to the Select Board."

The committee met for the first time on March 7th and plans to meet on a bi-weekly basis. All meetings are open to the public and will be held in the Town Office Meeting Room. Next meeting is Thursday March 24th at 7 pm.

Brian Sites was selected as chair of the committee with Darla Hamlin serving as vice-chair. Other members include: Steve Barr, Clark Baston, Stephen Friedrich, Paul Hdgetts and Jennifer Smith. Rod Duckworth was named alternate.

The Committee will present a final report of their findings and subsequent recommendations to the Select Board.
