The minutes to the June 2022 meeting were approved.

New Business:

I. **Jackie Hersey** reported on some of her Community Center plans. She and her assistant, Jackson Humphrey, hope to have at least one community event a month. Present plans include a Trunk or Treat event on Saturday October 29, a kids' yard sale on Saturday November 20 and a Tree Lighting ceremony in December. Ways that LWN Y could support her plans were discussed. Jackie will get in touch with Ann Dillon to determine how the LWN Y volunteer list could be incorporated into event needs. Peggy Leonard suggested that the sounding board (made up of LWN Y members) for the Community Center be re-instated. Amy Haile will discuss options for that group with the town manager.

Old Business:

I. **Story Walk Update: Diane Morrison**

- a. Diane Morrison reported that the new Story Walk will officially open on Saturday September 24 at 1PM.
- b. The Kiosk, donated by Joe Lucey, has been installed. Clark Bastion and the Public Works department, the Morrison family, Hammond Lumber, and Maine paints have all been very generous in help and donations. Several members of the LWN Y committee have been out raking and grooming trails in their free time. Jackie Hersey has also volunteered to help with graphics for the individual boards.
- c. Jackie has placed information regarding the opening on the WCCH FB page and is planning on starting an Instagram page for the trail.
- d. A sign has been created asking people to consider leashing their dogs on the trail so as to protect the many small children who are anticipated to be enjoying story walks. Amy Haile will present that plan for approval to the full Select Board at the 9/20 meeting.
- e. There was discussion regarding creating a "Friends of Story Walk" group to help Jackie Hersey oversee the trails and change out the books.
- f. Diane Morrison described the Fairy Woods area on the trail, which she has created.

II. Kite Festival: Steve Palmer

- a. Steve reports that volunteers have stepped up to put up the signs for the October 1 Kite Festival, take care of music, parking, bubble station, kite making, face painting, corn hole, and cardboard sledding. More volunteers are still needed for set-up.
- b. The Congregational Church, Historical Center, and Fire Company will all have tables for fundraising.
- c. Dogs must be leashed at all times.
