I. Call to Order

II. Minutes Approval

- a. Scott moves to accept as presented
- **b.** Bob seconds
- c. Unanimous motion

III. Parks and Recreation Business

- a. Town Forest discussion with Clark
 - Due to off leash dog complaints, P&R proposes to use the large parcel of the town forest as an off-leash dog park and keep all other parks on-leash only
 - 1. Bobby Silcott, ACO, comments that enforcement is the key to all ordinances, but given he only works 8 hrs/week plus on call here, most of it is on the honor system, as he patrols randomly
 - a. Most violations of animal ordinances are 1x=fine, 2x=double fine, 3x=court
 - b. The #1 complaint he receives is people not cleaning up after their dogs
 - 2. The new Animal Control ordinance was supposed to go through at Town Meeting
 - a. Yarmouth allows off leash 100 yards from public areas (parking lots, etc.)
 - b. Cumberland is off leash at the Town Forest ONLY

Commented [AL1]: Or is it the animal control language in our parks ordinance?

- i. They use a brochure with a QR code to all ordinance language
- For Knight's Pond, both towns must agree Cumberland is currently off-leash there
- d. If we want to pass this change of Town Forest to dog park, now is that time before Town Meeting language approval
- 3. Dogs in the Town Forest would still need to be under voice control per state law
- 4. Next Steps: Bobby & Rosemary to insert proper wording into both the Parks and Animal Control ordinances before an October town meeting and send to P&R before any changes made to Town Forest

ii. YWD boundaries

- Committee to figure out a time to walk it with Clark to determine just where the lines are
- iii. Parking area and trail prep
 - Fire Chief Payson will most likely want uniform trail width, if it is gravel
 - a. Committee is currently leaning towards just clearing out brush to widen the trail
 - b. Wet areas are of concern
 - c. The path itself doesn't have to be 7', but clearance on both sides + the trail should = 7'
 - RRCT offers to help lay it out and volunteer labor on trail crew days
 - i. Clark can bush hog some it it, to allow for a 6-8 car parking area
 - Town Excavator is meant to be used on blacktop, but could potentially rent something else
 - e. Potentially a fall clean up day aimed at dog owners & local Boy Scout troops with a pre-established layout
- iv. Steve Palmer suggests considering WEstcustogo Park as a dog park in addition to Town Forest
 - 1. Not a huge draw like the other parks, because there are no trails
 - 2. Town Forest has a lot of hunters (deer bowhunting)
 - 3. Bobby, ACO, echoes that Westcustogo seems to be the least used park
 - 4. Potential to do 2 parks non-leashed (but still voice control!)
 - a. Can do trial period first
 - 5. Scott concern re: gate closing @ Westcustogo in the winter
 - a. Push gate back 60' to let people still park and use it

- Bob makes motion that OTHP & Chandler Brook are leash-only parks
 - a. Scott seconds, unanimous motion
 - b. Rosemary to send ordinance changes
 - c. P&R members to scout out Town Forest with Clark
- b. Connectivity Update from Alan Stearns
 - i. The rights that North Yarmouth has on the snowmobile trail from Oak Hill Rd/Rt 9 through Lufkin Rd (Old Range Rd?) would be best served to have in writing in regards to public access not in the winter
 - Snowmobile trail currently goes down Sweetser Rd and is landowner access, not a public way/rangeway in terms of managing recreation
 - 2. Alan recommends legal measures, albeit with no sense of urgency
 - 3. Bob would like us to scout it out to make a more informed decision
 - ii. Old railroad bed/Sam Ristich corridor
 - 1. Does it connect to RT 231?
 - There should also be something in writing about this in a management plan in terms of knowing exactly what we own
 - iii. Memak Preserve
 - 1. Ed & Joyce Gervais are donating 35 acres (leash free!)
 - a. RRCT raising money for kiosk, parking area, legal fees,
 - b. Will be bike & snowmobile friendly land
 - iv. Pineland
 - The state is investing money into Pineland lands at the north end of NY
 - a. Trails signs, etc
- c. Management Plan
 - i. Should we have 1 plan for all parks or should each park have its own?
 - ii. Bryan reached out to Ben Smith about a plan and is waiting to hear back
 - 1. Bringing someone on to draft this will be necessary and helpful
 - iii. No current plan for Chandler Brook puts RRCT in a tough place re: conservation easement for 9 years PRIORITY
 - 1. Affects all our credibility
 - iv. P&R will start drafting templates before September meeting
- d. OTHP
 - i. Boardwalk removal
 - 1. The email from David (former Boy Scout's dad) is being treated as a concession to remove it
 - 2. Factors for removing it
 - a. Safety
 - i. Gets very icy in winter

- ii. Attracts stinging insect nests/hives underneath in warm weather
- 3. Clark will wait until late fall/winter when things dry out to remove it
- ii. The bridge on the back trail also needs attention
- iii. Dead trees
 - 1. Rosemary scouted this out twice
 - a. Along the entrance to the right slope
 - i. If trees are cleared and filled in with other plants, could be sledding hill
 - Dead conifers and cherry trees to come down will aid future kite festivals
 - 1. US Fish & Wildlife easement language may impact this

e. Park signs

- i. Suggested edits dogs on leash at all times? Does this need to go to Select Board?
 - 1. Will wait until the animal control language is confirmed
- ii. Will include "fireworks prohibited"

f. New members

- i. Bryan reached out to Nicole Hughes as a potential member who had submitted an application
 - She is currently pregnant and does not want to do in person meetings at this time

g. Baston Park

- i. Sevee & Maher (?) still in process of researching dredging will probably not get off the ground until next year
 - 1. In the meantime, Public Works will clean it up
- ii. How will potential Yarmouth dam removal affect our water levels?
 - 1. Bridge St dam removal would have no impact
 - East Elm St dam removal would, but that will probably not happens for 10-20 years and would cause about a 5' reduction at OTHP
 - a. Still worth pursuing access now

h. Chandler Brook

- i. Field should be hayed, but if it can't be (bobolinks, etc) maybe turn into a migratory milkweed stop for monarchs
 - 1. Will have to remove easement plan
- i. Set Next Meeting Date
