1. Call to Order: 7:03 PM

- 2. Open Public Hearing on Review of Remote Meeting Policy
 - a. No resident attendees, no comments
 - b. Vote to accept the Remote Meeting Policy Scott moved, Lisa seconded. Passed unanimously.

4. New Business

- a. Discussion around format of Recycling Fair Event
 - i. Laurie asked the group to consider the scope of the fair given the potential COVID impact on an April (likely indoor) event. She mentioned a couple of possible alternatives:
 - 1. Change the date to coincide with the NY town clean-up day in June
 - 2. Hold mini-recycling events to go along with other town events, such as summer concerts, family movie nights
 - ii. Lisa liked the idea of aligning with the town clean-up day in June and suggested preceding the event with a FreeCycle event, where residents could have a table to offer their unwanted, but still useful, items
 - iii. Darcy summarized that a change in the scope of the event could still meet our primary objectives as a committee.
 - 1. Provide information about the importance of recycling properly to reduce waste and keep municipal costs down.
 - 2. Highlight simple, but impactful, individual actions that can add up to a positive and powerful impact at the town/state/global levels.
 - iv. Discussion around having an event that is small, but impactful
 - 1. Offering event alongside a craft fair with upcycled items
 - a. Make sure that vendors are in alignment with recycling focus and be aware of the downstream impacts of the products we are featuring
 - 2. Including a component targeted towards children/families
 - v. Possible Booth/Activity Ideas
 - 1. Garbage to Garden composting
 - 2. EcoMaine displays about dos and don'ts for recycling, games
 - a. Lisa will follow up with EcoMaine about their offerings
 - Allagash Brewing does recycling of metal caps and plastic PakTech carriers, natural corks, metal cages, caps, brown paper, and bubble wrap

- a. Fact Sharing for Topic Areas
 - i. (Plastics & Composting) Jim sent the following information.
 - 1. Plastics:
 - a. Up to 12. 7 million tons of plastic enters the oceans every year.
 - b. Only about 9 % of plastics produced since the 1950's has been recycled.
 - c. There are 5,000,000,000 (billion) pieces of plastic in the oceans.
 - 2. Composting:
 - a. There is evidence that composting has been around since Neolithic Times!
 - b. In 2018 292 million tons of Municipal Solid Waste was collected. 94 million tons were recycled (32%).
 - c. Worms can compost! Check out Vermicomposting.
