

3 Easy Ways to Register/Renew Your Dog License:

#1: Go online to complete the registration at: State of Maine Online Dog Registrations

#2: Stop by the Town Office and register your dog in person. *Make sure you have a copy of your dog's rabies certificate!*


#3: Complete the application available on the **Town website** & mail the following to Town of North Yarmouth, 10 Village Square RD, North Yarmouth, ME 04097

- 1. -your application
- 2. -your payment (checks made payable to the Town of North Yarmouth
- 3. -copy of your dog's rabies

Once it is processed, we will mail you back your dog license.

Dog Licensing Fees:

\$6 per year for spayed/neutered dogs





Clearing Snow from Fire Hydrants

It's that time of year when we need our communities help. If you have a hydrant near your home please shovel a clear path to and around the hydrant. This will save a great amount of time if there is a fire emergency at your home or in your neighborhood. Thank you for helping keep you and your neighbors safe this chilly winter!



Winter Sand for Residential Driveways

Winter sand is available for residents' personal use. Each residential dwelling is eligible for up to 20 gallons (four 5 gallon pails) of sand per storm. The use of municipal sand for the sanding of private roads is prohibited.

Sand pile is located at the entrance of the PWD facilities – 40 Parsonage Rd.

Winter Parking Ban



The parking of vehicles upon any public highway between the hours of 12:01AM and 6AM during the period from November 15th through April 15th is prohibited.

Any vehicles parked in violations of this ordinance may be hauled away at the owner's expense in accordance with the provisions of MRSA Title 29 Sec. 4.





Road Commissioner tips on Public Works snow plowing in our community.

- Be patient and keep a safe distance behind our working snow plows.
- \succ Never pass a snow plow.
- Don't crowd the plow
- Move Aside and Provide Room: Snow plows often drive along the centerline of a roadway to remove snow.
- ➢ Be aware of reduced visibility.

*Take extra time during the winter months when driving. The road conditions can change dramatically.



Destruction of Student Records: Class of 2015

Notice to all persons who attended MSAD #51 Public School in the graduating class of 2015 or to their custodial parents: **MSAD** #51 shall maintain permanently a record of a student's name, address, phone number, grades, attendance record, classes attended, grade level completed and year completed on our online data storage site. Cumberland/North Yarmouth School Department may have the remnants of cumulative files in its possession for students in the graduating class of 2015 and will destroy such records after January 12, 2018. If you would like to have the remnants of your cumulative folder rather than having them destroyed, please contact the Greely High School Guidance office secretary, Anne Cornish at acornish@msad51.org by December 15, 2017 to make arrangements for obtaining the records. All cumulative file remnants not picked up by January 12, 2018 will be destroyed.



MSAD #51 Kindergarten Registration
