

License your dog online!

There are 3 Easy Ways to register/renew your dog license for the year 2020:

#1: Complete the application [HERE](#) & mail the following to the Town Office (10 Village Square Rd., North Yarmouth, ME 04097): your application, payment (checks made payable to the Town of North Yarmouth), and a copy of your dog's rabies certificate. Once it is processed, we will mail the license to you.

#2: Between October 15th and January 31st, you may go [online](#) to complete the registration.

#3: Stop by the Town Office and register your dog in person. Make sure you have a copy of your dog's rabies certificate.

Searching for the “Oldest” citizen in Town



North Yarmouth’s Boston Post Cane must once again be awarded to the “oldest” citizen in town. The tradition of the Boston Post Cane was started in August 1909 by Boston Post Publisher, Edwin A. Grozier. He distributed some 600 canes to New England towns, which were to be awarded to the Oldest Citizen in town and at his or her death to be transmitted to the next oldest living citizen.

To be eligible to receive the honor a person must:

- 1) Be the oldest living person residing in North Yarmouth at the time designation is made;
 - 2) Must have resided in the Town of North Yarmouth within the last five years and a U.S. Citizen not less than 15 of the last 40 years.
 - 3) Must be able and willing to receive the honor in person or through a family member

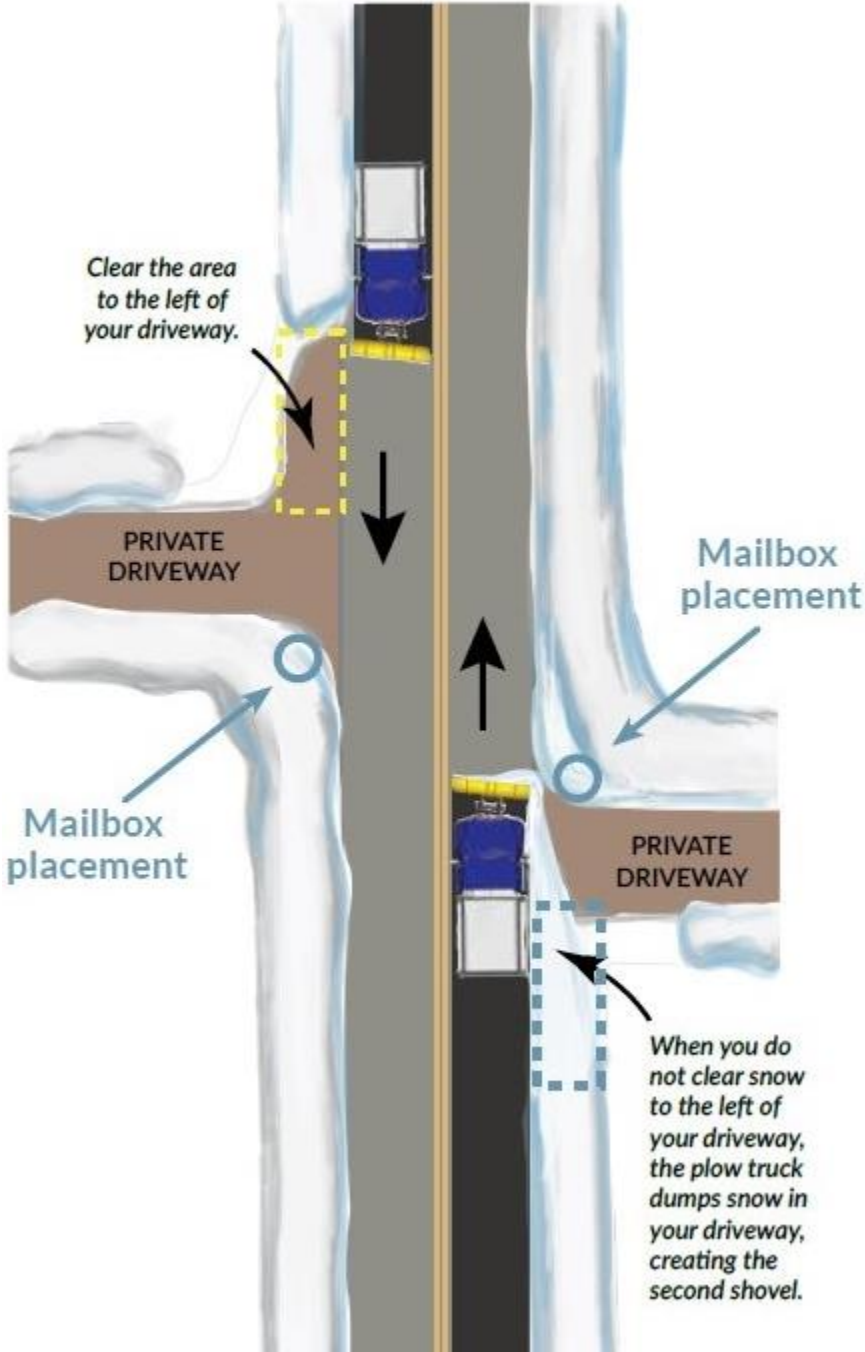

Winter Sand for Residential Driveways

Winter sand is available for residents' personal use. Each residential dwelling is eligible for up to 20 gallons (four 5gallon pails) of sand per storm. The use of municipal sand for the sanding of private roads is prohibited.

Sand pile is located at the entrance of the PWD facilities – 40 Parsonage Rd.

Maine State Law states a person may not place and allow to remain on a public way snow or slush that has not accumulated there naturally.



Town of North Yarmouth Winter Parking Ban

- The parking of vehicles upon any public highway between the hours of 12:01AM and 6AM during the period from November 15th through April 15th is prohibited.
- Any vehicles parked in violations of this ordinance may be hauled away at the owner's expense in accordance with the provisions of M.R.S.A. Title 29 Sec. 4.



Curbside Pickup Reminders

Residents **MUST** have their household waste & recycling at the curb by **7am** on the day of scheduled pickup.

Reasons why ...

The following items could affect your normal pick up time.

- Number of trucks picking up on that day.
- Weather can delay or create an earlier pickup.
- Mechanical issues with a haul truck.

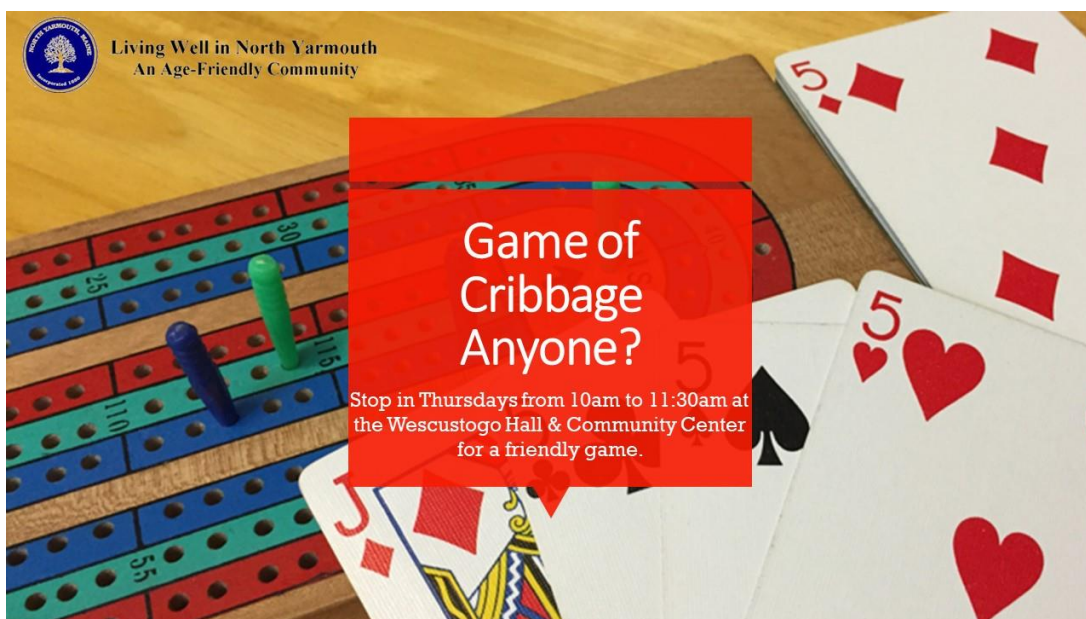
- Casella Waste Systems picks up on all holidays except for Thanksgiving and Christmas.

- If Casella Waste Systems does need to cancel or delay a schedule pickup day the Town Office should be notified and staff will post this information on the Town website and social media accounts (Facebook, Instagram and Twitter)

PRIVATE ROADS

If your private road meets the criteria for Casella Waste Systems to travel on and owners have made arrangements for this service, the road must be properly maintained for service to be provided. If the road is not plowed, sanded or has flooded, for the safety of their employees, Casella will not travel on the road to pick up your household waste and recycling.

MSAD#51 Pre-K Application

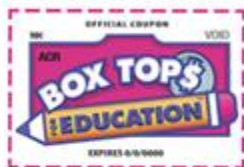

THE OLD BOX TOPS CLIPS



Traditional Box Tops are being phased out of production, but you can still encourage school supporters to send any remaining unexpired clips to school.

Every valid Box Tops clip is worth 10¢ for your school. They don't need to be clipped perfectly; just make sure each one has a clearly visible product acronym and expiration date.

*All valid Box Tops clips submitted per the Program Rules by a Coordinator(s) of (an) eligible, enrolled school(s) will be honored.

THE NEW BOX TOPS LABELS



Eventually the Box Tops program will become digital-only. Participating brands are starting to change their packaging from a traditional Box Tops clip to the new Box Tops label. **Please do not submit the new labels.**

If you see this label, use the new Box Tops app to scan your receipt. **Box Tops are still worth 10¢ for your school.** The app will find participating products purchased at any store and instantly add cash to your school's earnings online.

This year there are BIG changes coming to the Box Tops program, including a grocery receipt-scanning program, which will eventually take the place of physically clipping Box Tops. For now, you can do both. We would REALLY appreciate your help this year, both in continuing to clip the "clip able" Box Tops AND downloading and using the app for the program. We will be continuing to collect clip able Box Tops at any time. Feel free to submit them at North Yarmouth Town Office.
