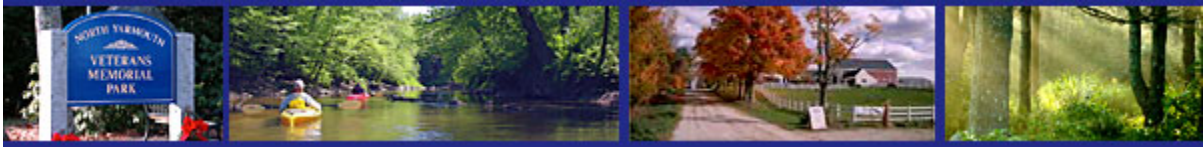

3 Easy Ways to Register/Renew Your Dog License:

#1: Go online to complete the registration at: [State of Maine Online Dog Registrations](#)

#2: Stop by the Town Office and register your dog in person. *Make sure you have a copy of your dog's rabies certificate!*

#3: Complete the application available on the [Town website](#) & mail the following to Town of North Yarmouth, 10 Village Square RD, North Yarmouth, ME 04097

1. -your application
2. -your payment (checks made payable to the Town of North Yarmouth)
3. -copy of your dog's rabies

Once it is processed, we will mail you back your dog license.

\$6 per year for spayed/neutered dogs \$11 per year for dogs not spayed/neutered

Winter Sand for Residential Driveways

Winter sand is available for residents' personal use. Each residential dwelling is eligible for up to 20 gallons (four 5 gallon pails) of sand per storm. The use of municipal sand for the sanding of private roads is prohibited.

Sand pile is located at the entrance of the PWD facilities – 40 Parsonage Rd.

Economic Development and Sustainability Committee Meets once a month

This committee works on the development and promotion of sustainable economic strategies supported by the community that will strengthen the local economy, utilize resources and meet the current and future needs of North Yarmouth.

The committee is currently working on the placement and setup of Tax Increment Financing districts within the Village Center.

Planning Board Meets once a month

The Planning Board is responsible for oversight and management of the North Yarmouth Land Use Ordinance. The Board works closely with the Code Enforcement Office to uphold and fulfill the town's ordinance as well as related state laws providing revisions recommendations or as needed or required.

Joint Standing Committee North Yarmouth & Cumberland Meets as needed

The Joint Standing Committee members work together on the different community services and facilities that are shared between the two towns with the focus on Adult & Youth Recreation programs, Prince Memorial Library, and parks, i.e., Knight's Pond Preserve. Because the two towns share management of these, community leaders meet as to maintain services and provide for positive communications.

Budget Committee Appointed Positions Meets January - April

It is the responsibility of this committee to review of the Town Manager's proposed town budget providing input or suggestions regarding proposed expenditures and revenues to the Town Manager and the Select Board.

Acceptable Items Include:

- Vegetables, fruit, citrus, bread
- Cooked & raw food
- Pits, peels, shells, bones & seeds
- Meat, dairy & bread
- Coffee grounds, filters and tea bags (without the staple)
- Clean, non-glossy paper
- Napkins, food-soiled paper products, wax paper, muffin liners
- Hair & laundry lint)
