Reminder to Register Your Dog Now for 2019



Dog Licensing Fees:

- -\$6 per year for spayed/neutered dogs
- -\$11 per year for dogs not spayed/neutered.
- *Per state law, any dog license that is renewed after January 31st is subject to a \$25 late fee.*

3 Easy Ways to register/renew your dog license:

#1: Complete the application **HERE** & mail the following to the Town Office (10 Village Square Rd., North Yarmouth, ME 04097): your application, payment (checks made payable to the Town of North Yarmouth), and a copy of your dog's rabies certificate. Once it is processed, we will mail the license to you.

#2: Between October 15th and January 31st, you may go online to complete the registration: **Online Dog Licensing**

#3: Stop by the Town Office and register your dog in person. Make sure you have a copy of your dog's rabies certificate!


ADOPT A HYDRANT

The parking of vehicles on any public highway between the hours of 12:01AM and 6AM during the period from November 15th through April 15th is prohibited.

Any vehicles parked in violation of this ordinance will be hauled away at the owner's expense in accordance with the provisions of MRSA Title 29 Sec. 4.





Have you applied for a Homestead Exemption in North Yarmouth? The Homestead Exemption currently provides a reduction of \$20,000 in the value of your home for property tax purposes. To qualify;

- You must be a permanent resident of Maine.
- The home must be your permanent residence.
- You must have owned a home in Maine for the 12 months prior to applying.
- Applications must be filed on/before April 1st with the municipality where the property is located.

Click the following link to download the <u>Homestead Exemption Application</u>. All forms must be returned to the Assessor's Office at 10 Village Square Road, North Yarmouth, ME 04097. **Applications must be received by April 1st** for it to apply to the upcoming fiscal tax year.
