- Yes **Question 1: Shall the Town authorize the Board of Selectmen to:**
- No A) Create a municipal and community campus on the Memorial School parcel by renovating and reusing a portion of the school facility including the gymnasium; and
- B) Sell the existing Town Hall parcel for residential and/or commercial development to increase the tax and employment base; and
- C) Create a sewer system infrastructure that will enable these specific proposals A)

and B), and stimulate future village development as envisioned in the Town Comprehensive Plan while protecting the aquifer resource.

- Yes **Question 2: Shall the Town authorize the Board of Selectmen to:**
- No
- A) Immediately terminate making any expenditures and performing any work to study or to develop a Municipal sewer system;
 - B) Rebuild Wescustogo Hall in compliance with the 1997 agreement under which the Town accepted the property;
 - C) Retain the current Town Hall and land. Make renovations and additions to the building as needed over time for municipal purposes;
 - D) Solicit through a Request for Proposal (RFP) creative plans to renovate, repurpose, replace or sell the Memorial School building and property. Such proposals should consider but not be limited to public uses, private uses, senior housing, or combinations thereof. The Board of Selectmen shall not direct any specific uses to be included or excluded in the Proposals;
 - E) Bring all the Request for Proposals (RFP) received to Public Hearings to solicit resident feedback and then bring a recommended plan for the Memorial School property to a municipal vote in a manner that will maximize resident turnout;

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS**Walk Safely**

- Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks.
- Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- Put electronic devices down and keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.

Trick or Treat With an Adult

- Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, they should stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.

Keep Costumes Both Creative and Safe

- Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.
- Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

Drive Extra Safely on Halloween

- Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- Take extra time to look for kids at intersections, on medians and on curbs.
- Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.
- Eliminate any distractions inside your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.
- Drive slowly, anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic and turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.
- Popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. so be especially alert for kids during those hours.

Hunting Regulations in Old Town House Park

Old Town House Park Hunting Permission Regulations

Hunting in Old Town House Park shall be by **Permission Only**. In Old Town House Park and all other North Yarmouth areas, discharge of firearms shall be **Shotgun Only**.

Any person may seek and receive permission to hunt in Old Town House Park by registration and application through the North Yarmouth Town Office. The Town Office authorized personnel shall issue to each applicant a **Hunter Permission Card** to evidence that permission has been granted by the Town of North Yarmouth for the season indicated on the card. Hunters must register each year separately for each fall and/or spring season (fall season runs from November 1 to November 30, spring season runs from May 1 to May 31). The Permission Form is not transferable to any other person or party and must be carried on the person to whom it was issued. Every person, including children, hunting or in a hunting party must be separately registered.

Issuance of the Permission form shall be subject to the following terms and agreements:

1. The applicant/hunter shall complete and sign a **Hunter Permission Form** to evidence that he/she has read the terms and conditions of permission and agrees to abide thereby.
2. The applicant shall possess a valid State of Maine hunting license (either resident or non-resident) and agrees to abide by all applicable hunting laws and regulations and applicable local ordinances and park rules.
3. The applicant shall limit hunting and discharge of firearms to **shotgun use only**.
4. **TIMES FOR HUNTING ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

November: ½ hour before sunrise until noon

May: ½ hour before sunrise to noon

5. The applicant shall carry the issued **Hunter Permission Card** on his/her person at all times while hunting at Old Town House Park and shall present the card upon request to any state or local game or law enforcement party or any agent of the Town of North Yarmouth.
6. The hunter agrees to submit the **Hunter Survey** to the Town of North Yarmouth Town Office by mail or delivery by the end of each season and further understands that by not returning the survey form within 3 weeks of the end of the applicable hunting season, they will not be issued a permit for the subsequent hunting seasons.
7. The hunter agrees to report to the North Yarmouth Town Office by the earliest practical means any observations of illegal hunting, vandalism, unsafe or unsanitary conditions or activities, or any conditions or activities that damage or threaten the environment.
