Dog Licensing Fees:

\$6 per year for spayed/neutered dogs \$11 per year for dogs not spayed/neutered

Per state law, any dog license that is re-licensed after January 31,2018 will be subject to a \$25 late fee.

#2: Stop by the Town Office and register your dog in person. Make sure you have a copy of your dog's rabies certificate!

- 1. -your application
- 2. -your payment (checks made payable to the Town of North Yarmouth



Traffic Alert

Main Street Yarmouth Closed November 17th - 20th

Main Street in Yarmouth will close at 10 p.m. Friday, November 17th and reopen Monday, Nov. 20th at 4 a.m. while crews work around the clock to demolish parts of the Route 1 bridge that spans Main Street. There will be no pedestrian or motor vehicle access to Main Street directly under the bridge during this weekend.



Route 1 will remain open during the Main Street closure and drivers will still be able to access Route 1 from Main Street via York and School streets. There will be one lane of traffic in each direction on the Route 1 bridge throughout the year of construction.

The \$4.1 million project is expected to be completed by November 2018. The new bridge will include a 5-foot paved sidewalk on the east side of Route 1 and a new 10-foot multi-use path on its west. New lighting, railings and illuminated crosswalks will be installed to ensure safety. The new bridge will also have an extra foot of clearance underneath on Main Street – up to 15 feet 6 inches from 14 feet 7 inches.

All construction will be suspended during the 2018 Clam Festival in July.

MaineDOT regrets this inconvenience and encourages motorists to drive safely. Thank you.









Rebecca Brown, LCSW currently works at Maine Behavioral Healthcare as the Clinical Manager for the Department of Clinical Innovation. In her current position, Rebecca oversees the implementation of evidence based child trauma treatments locally and throughout the State of Maine. Rebecca has extensive experience providing training on a wide range of topics related to childhood anxiety, stress, and traumatic stress. Rebecca has advanced training and practice in four evidence-based child treatments and provides training and consultation to other clinicians in treating and supporting children and families exposed to stress and trauma. Rebecca has co-authored multiple national resources on the impact of domestic violence on children and received her MSW from Boston College. When Rebecca is not working on behalf of children, she enjoys spending time with her husband, two young sons, and dog and sharing with them the beauty of the outdoors.
