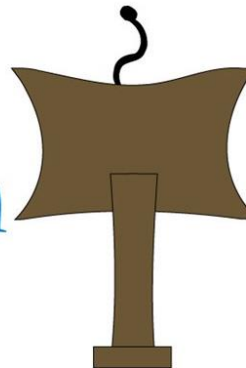

- The parking of vehicles upon any public highway between the hours of 12:01AM and 6AM during the period from November 15th through April 15th is prohibited.
- Any vehicles parked in violations of this ordinance may be hauled away at the owner's expense in accordance with the provisions of MRSA Title 29 Sec. 4.

**#1:** Complete the application [HERE](#) & mail the following to the Town Office (10 Village Square Rd., North Yarmouth, ME 04097): your application, payment (checks made payable to the Town of North Yarmouth), and a copy of your dog's rabies certificate. Once it is processed, we will mail the license to you.

**#2:** Between October 15th and January 31st, you may go [online](#) to complete the registration: Online Dog Licensing.

**#3:** Stop by the Town Office and register your dog in person. Make sure you have a copy of your dog's rabies certificate.

#### Intersection of Main St (Rt. 9), Blanchard RD and Tuttle RD



**Monday 11-18-19** at 10am the intersection will become a 4-way stop until Tuesday at 9am

**Tuesday 11-19-19** from 9am to 8pm the intersection will be CLOSED. You must seek alternate routes!

Heads up! The intersection of Main St (Rt. 9), Blanchard RD and Tuttle RD in the [Town of Cumberland](#) will be **CLOSED on Tuesday, November 19th from 9am-8pm**. All traffic must detour!

On Monday, November 18th crews will begin preparation work to move the Cumberland Historical Society from its existing location on Blanchard Road to the Prince Memorial Library campus. Due to the height of the building, the traffic lights and utility lines must be taken down to move the 166-year-old building to its new home.

We understand that this is a major traffic inconvenience and ask for your patience and understanding. Please plan accordingly and obey the posted speed limits along these roadways!

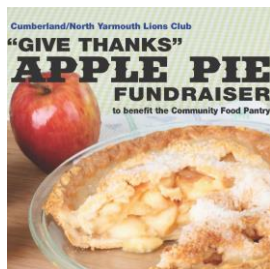

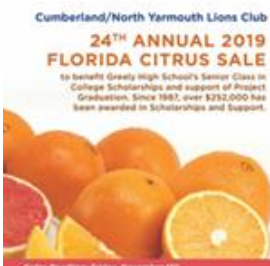

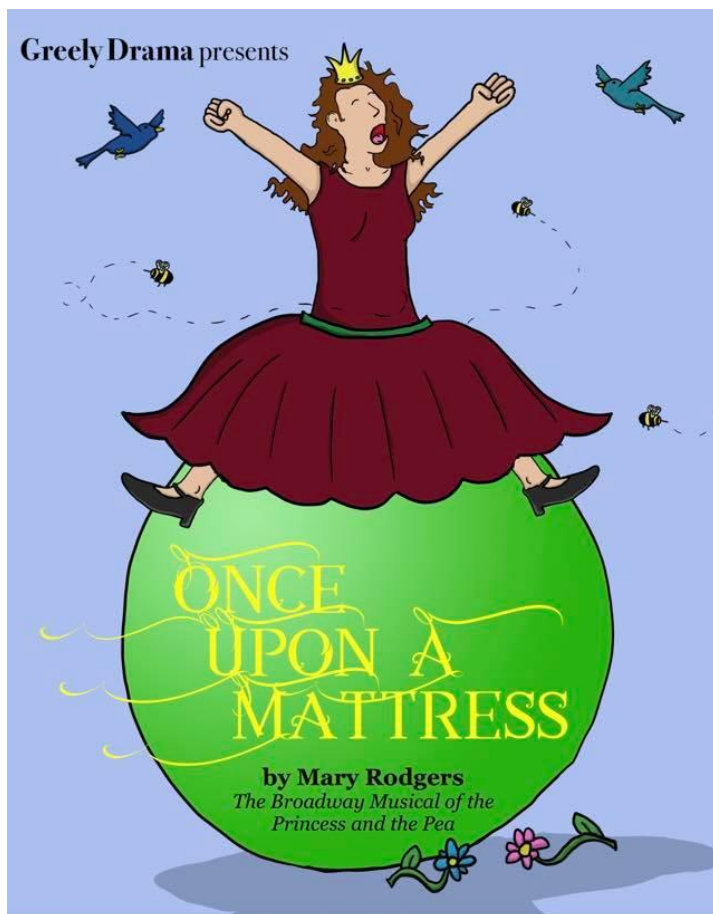
