On Saturday December 2, 2017, North Yarmouth Fire Rescue, Cumberland Fire Rescue, Gray Fire Rescue, and Falmouth Fire Rescue, will be conducting a live fire training exercise on the property located at 66 Walnut Hill Road in North Yarmouth. The tentative start time for firefighting operations will be 07:30. The purpose of this live fire training is to enhance firefighter's knowledge, skills and abilities in the area of structural firefighting. This live fire training will create a smoke condition in the immediate area. Please use caution when traveling through the area. The hydrant at the intersection of Bayberry Lane and Walnut Hill road will be utilized to fill fire apparatus during the evolutions.



Dog Licensing Fees:

\$6 per year for spayed/neutered dogs \$11 per year for dogs not spayed/neutered

Per state law, any dog license that is re-licensed after January 31,2018 will be subject to a \$25 late fee.

3 Easy Ways to Register/Renew Your Dog License:

- #1: Go online to complete the registration at: State of Maine Online Dog Registrations
- #2: Stop by the Town Office and register your dog in person. Make sure you have a copy of your dog's rabies certificate!
- #3: Complete the application available on the <u>Town website</u> & mail the following to Town of North Yarmouth, 10 Village Square RD, North Yarmouth, ME 04097
 - 1. -your application
 - 2. -your payment (checks made payable to the Town of North Yarmouth
 - 3. -copy of your dog's rabies

Once it is processed, we will mail you back your dog license.
