#### State & Local Elections March 3, 2020

Presidential Primary, Special State Referendum & North Yarmouth Select Board



On March 3, 2020 there will be a Presidential Primary, Special State Referendum and North Yarmouth Select Board Election. To participate in the Presidential Primary, you must be enrolled in either the Democratic or Republican Party.

**If you are unenrolled**, you may enroll in a party up until Election Day. Once enrolled in a party, you must stay enrolled in that party for at least 90 days.

**If you are enrolled**, but want to change parties, you must do so at least 15 days prior (February 13th) to the election.




#### ✓ Voting Polls

#### \*\*\*OLD TOWN HOUSE PARK – BOARD WALK REMOVAL\*\*\*



The Parks & Recreation committee and the Public Works Department will be removing the boardwalk that crosses the lower portion of the field near the entrance to Old Town House Park. Due to safety concerns and on-going maintenance issues, the committee has decided that this boardwalk is a hazard and is not necessary for the enjoyment of the park. Public Works will remove the boardwalk during the winter while the ground is frozen

to avoid disturbance to the field and to the wet area the boardwalk crosses. The trail will be rerouted to a location higher on the slope where it is drier and it can be maintained as a mowed path, similar to the rest of the trails in the park.

# Skyline Farm Carriage Museum's current winter exhibit "200 Years of Runners & Wheels




Horse-drawn vehicles, including some from the 1820's. Photo by Pamela Ames

Celebrating Maine's Bicentennial" highlights vehicles used circa 1820 in Maine. It is rare that a museum would have one vehicle 200 years old or older; however, Skyline has many, including three four-wheeled Pleasure and Comfort Waggons (old spelling), a two-wheeled doctor's Riding Chair used in Cornish, Maine, and a Boston Chaise. Also featured are many early sleighs including the Rudyard Kipling rattan sleigh, early Albany & Portland styles, Rural Mail, Booby Hut, Hearses, Doctors, and a School Bus.

The museum, located at 95 The Lane, North Yarmouth, is open for public viewing on Sundays, from February 23–March 29, 1-4 p.m. or by appointment. Free admission: donations are appreciated. Dress warmly as the museum is not heated.

The Lion King Movie Night Friday, March 6th @6:15pm (MIW Multi-Purpose Room)


