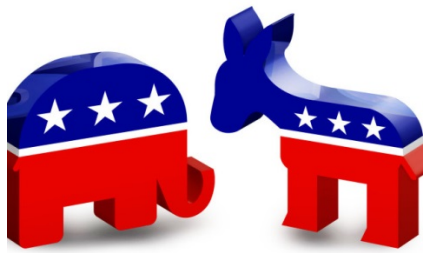

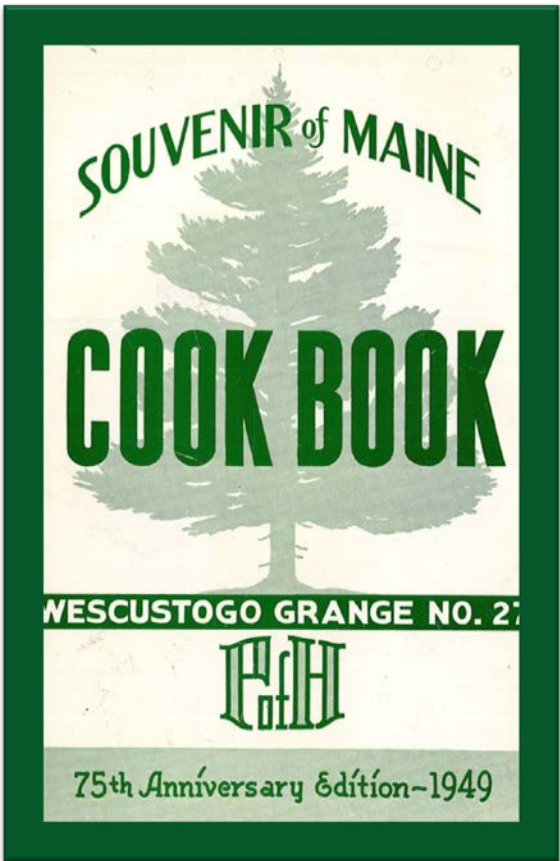
Local Party Caucuses

Winter Sand for Residential Driveways

Winter sand is available for residents’ personal use. Each residential dwelling is eligible for up to 20 gallons (four 5 gallon pails) of sand per storm. The use of municipal sand for the sanding of private roads is prohibited.

Sand pile is located at the entrance of the PWD facilities – 40 Parsonage Rd.

The Joint Standing Committee members work together on the different community services and facilities that are shared between the two towns with the focus on Adult & Youth Recreation programs, Prince Memorial Library, and parks, i.e., Knight's Pond Preserve. Because the two towns share management of these, community leaders meet as to maintain services and provide for positive communications.

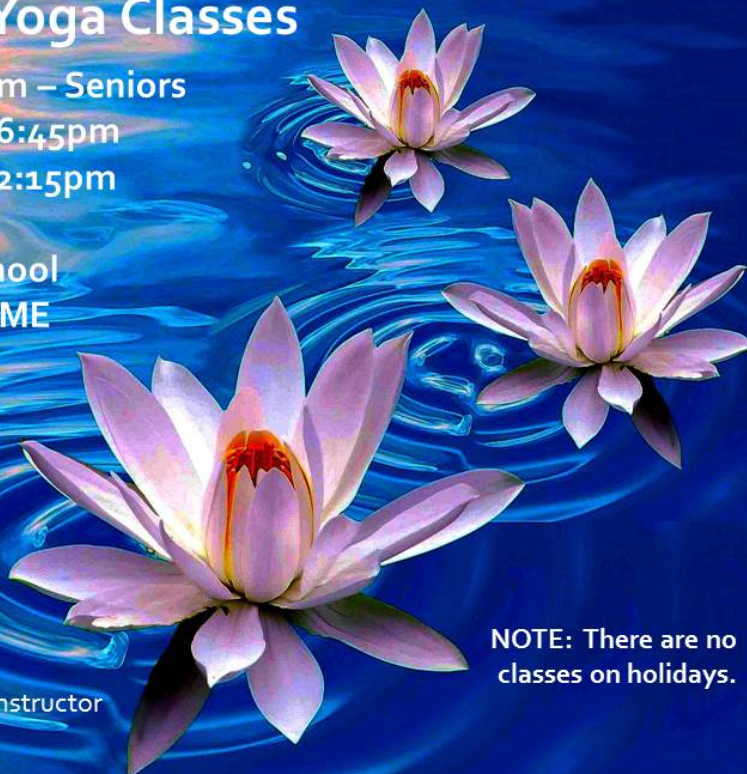
