Municipal Nomination Papers Available

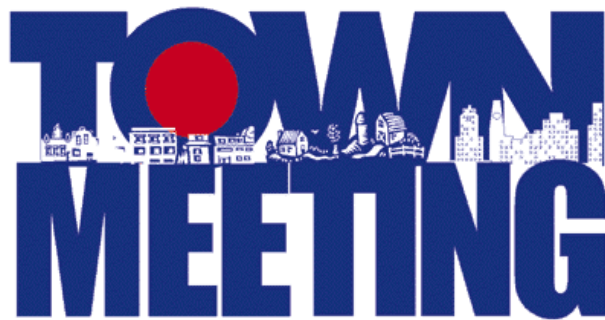


Nomination Papers for the June 11, 2019 Municipal Election are now available.

Open Elected Positions are as follows:

- Two seats for Select Board for a 3 year term.
- One seat for MSAD#51 Board of Directors for a 3 year term.
- One seat for Cemetery Commissioner for a 5 year term.
- Two seats for Budget Committee for a 3 year term.
- Two seats for Budget Committee for a 2 year term.

Nomination papers require a minimum of twenty-five (25) signatures of registered voters but no more than seventy five (75) signatures of registered voters. The deadline to submit the nomination papers to the Town Clerk is Thursday, April 11, 2019 before the close of business, at 5pm.

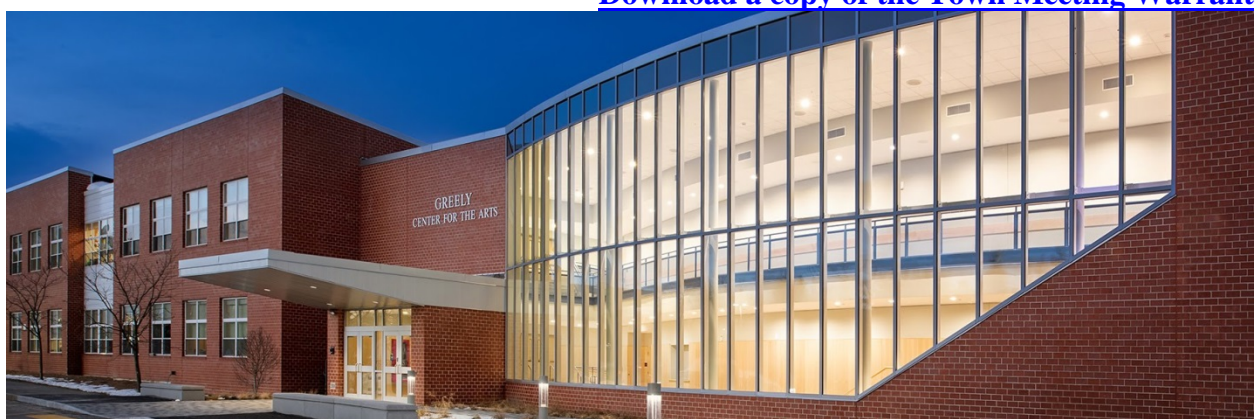

MSAD #51 is pleased to announce that we will be starting a small public Pre-K Program for 32 students (16 each session) starting in September 2019. The information listed on this flyer will provide you with some additional information about this new program. THE BASICS

WHO?

Children living in Cumberland & North Yarmouth who turn 4 before October 15, 2019. If your child turns 5 prior to October 15, they will not be eligible for Pre-K.

WHAT?

Classroom size will be limited to 16 students, with a total of 32 students total between the morning and afternoon sessions.

WHERE?

The Pre-K program will be housed at Mabel I. Wilson School and will be in partnership with Child Development Services (CDS).

WHEN?

Beginning in the 2019-2020 school year, the program will run half days, morning and afternoon sessions, four days per week (M, T, Th, F) for approximately 135 days during the school year.

REGISTRATION

If you are interested in your child participating in the 2019-2020 half day Pre-K program, please complete this form no later than **Friday, April 12, 2019**.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Screenings will take place at Mabel I. Wilson School for eligible children on June 11, 12 and 13, 2019.

Transportation will be provided to those who are enrolled in the program.

Tentative first day of school is September 9, 2019.

On June 17, 2019 at 8:00AM, a public lottery will take place at Mabel I. Wilson School to select the students who will attend the program for the 2019-2020 school year.

Parents do not need to attend this lottery selection, but are welcome to if they choose. Parents will be contacted after the public lottery selection regarding the status of their child's application.
