Senior Tax Credit

If you are age 70 or older, with an annual income of \$40,000 or less and lived in North Yarmouth for 10 years or more you may qualify for the Senior Tax Credit.

Application deadline is June 30, 2019.

Effective with the start of Fiscal Year 2020 (July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020), property taxes will be due quarterly on the following due dates:

- **September 15, 2019**
- **December 15, 2019**
- **March 15, 2020**
- **June 15, 2020**

Film Screening: Dawnland

Friday, June 14th @6:30pm-9:00pm (*Greely Center for the Arts*)



The Greely High School Civil Rights Team and Congregational Church in Cumberland UCC Social Justice Team Present Dawnland: A Documentary About Cultural Survival and Stolen Children. Freewill donations accepted to support Maine-Wabanaki REACH. For most of the 20th century, government agents systematically forced Native American children from their homes and placed them with white families. As recently as the 1970's, one in four Native children nationwide were living in non-Native foster care, adoptive homes, or boarding schools. Many children experienced devastating emotional and physical harm by adults who mistreated them and tried to erase their cultural identity.

Now, for the first time, they share their stories. The feature-length documentary follows the Maine Truth and Reconciliation Commission to contemporary Wabanaki communities to reveal the untold narrative of Indigenous child removal.

A Maine-Wabanaki REACH representative will answer questions and facilitate a discussion following the film. Maine-Wabanaki REACH is a cross-cultural collaboration that successfully supported the Maine-Wabanaki State Child Welfare Truth and Reconciliation Commission and continues to support Wabanaki communities in wellness, healing, and positive change.

Skyline Farm Carriage Museum's current exhibit "Ladies and Gentlemen" shows how horse-drawn vehicles were designed and built specifically to match various sizes, classes and genders of their occupants. This exhibit shows the "finer" lighter vehicles which were generally built for women and the "bulkier" heavier ones for men.

As you walk through the exhibit, you can have fun guessing who the vehicle was originally built for, and the answers are on each podium.

"Ladies and Gentlemen" also highlights the Boston chaise and three new Studebaker vehicles added to our collection: a lovely parasol top Basket Phaeton and two dusty road water sprinkler wagons.

New collections of bridle rosettes and bog/marsh and lawn shoes (think summer snowshoes) are on display, too.

The museum, located at 95 The Lane, North Yarmouth, is open for public viewing on Sundays through June 30, 1-4 p.m. or by appointment. Free admission; donations are appreciated.
