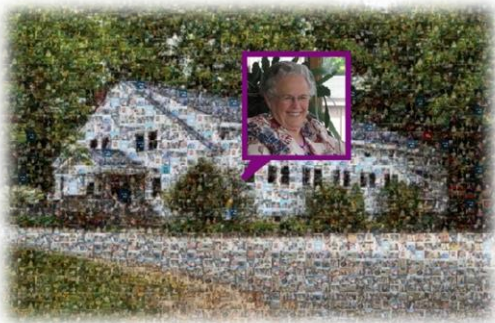
Why “Friends of Wescustogo”?

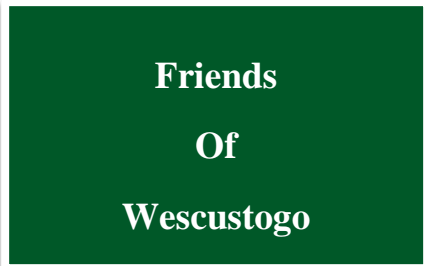

Effective with the start of Fiscal Year 2020 (July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020), property taxes will be due quarterly on the following due dates:

- **September 15, 2019**
- **December 15, 2019**
- **March 15, 2020**
- **June 15, 2020**

Interest begins the day following the above listed due dates.

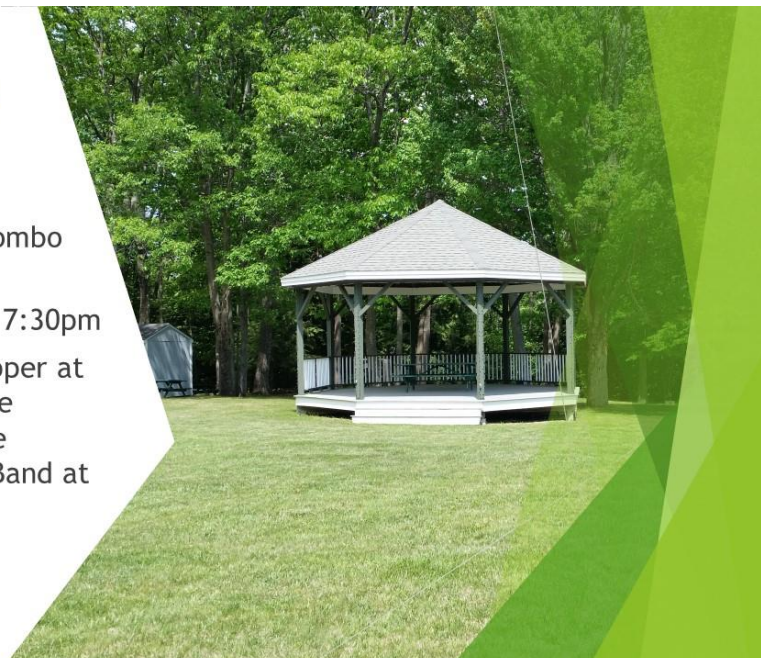
