

Planning to travel this fall and have questions about REAL ID? Check out the Secretary of State's new brochure for more information. Their office has a waiver in place through October 10, 2018, so you can still use your Maine license or ID to fly commercially. They have applied for that waiver to be renewed, and will keep us posted as the date nears.

November Notice of Election



The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018 at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, located at 247 Walnut Hill Road. The polls will be open from 7AM-8PM. During the November Election, Maine voters will elect one of Maine's two United States Senators, Maine's Governor, two Representatives to Congress, members of the Maine Legislature, and certain county officers. There will also be referendum questions on the ballot.

Applications for Absentee Ballots are available now at the Town Office or <u>Online</u>. The actual ballot will not be mail out till October when we receive them from the Secretary of State's Office. The last day to request an absentee ballot is Thursday, November 1, 2018.


FREE YardScaping Workshop Thursday, September 13th 6-8pm



Skyline Farm is excited about hosting their 5th 5K trail run/walk. Each year the event draws familiar friends and family as well new faces to the farm. The race is an opportunity for people to become familiar with Skyline's trails and all that the farm has to offer the community.
