The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018 at the **Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, located at 247 Walnut Hill Road.** The polls will be open from 7AM-8PM. During the November Election, Maine voters will elect one of Maine's two United States Senators, Maine's Governor, two Representatives to Congress, members of the Maine Legislature, and certain county officers. There will also be referendum questions on the ballot.


