 - No fees for additional kiosk locations
 - Additional Questions for Garbage to Garden:
 - What are the criteria for hosting additional kiosks?
 - What is the threshold for having curbside pick-up?
 - Curbside Pick-Up:
 - 175 residents in NY have already expressed interest on the Garbage to Garden website
